Dear Ladies,

This password is in reference to the glorious sterling silver teapot that the original UVA Faculty Wives Club acquired and engraved with the date commemorating its founding year, 1949. The picture is above. You need to remember this password, SILVERTEAPOT, as it is about the only information NOT on the UVA Women's Club Website. The roster also now can include two phone numbers. To enlighten us on the history of the website, I did a little digging and I asked Kris Bean and Laura Hoffman to fill me in. This is what I learned: Women's Club had an online presence in the early 90s. The designers of the early website are unknown at this time, but eventually Verna O'Connell asked her husband, John O'Connell, to sponsor Women's Club so that the website could be located on a UVA server and that its web address - its URL - would end in virginia.edu. Because the club is not an official part of the University, our website is grouped with the websites of other "independent organizations" that are typically student-run. That is why the website URL includes the term "indorgs." Later, in 2010, Kris and Laura worked as a team to redesign the early website and add pages on various club activities and groups. Laura had experience designing and maintaining her own website, but Kris had to learn Dreamweaver from scratch, with Laura's help. They had to acquire UVA digital IDs and passwords to have access to the UVA



site. James Hilton, Molly Hilton's husband, helped guide them through the process. Upon John O'Connell's retirement, Kris's husband, John Bean, assumed the sponsorship of the website. Upon the recent retirement of Kris's and Laura's husbands, a new sponsor was needed. The UVA Women's Club is so fortunate to have Charles Grisham, Rosemary's husband, willing to step into this role. Due to his background in publishing his own books, he has used this knowledge to our advantage.
